
The seventh and last of our series on the “I am” sayings of Jesus. This week, “I am the true vine” (John 15:1) [John 15:1-17]

It resonates very much with our ‘Staying Connected’ theme.

The vine had become symbolic for the nation of Israel. But Jesus was saying that a living relationship with Him was what counted as the most important thing – as He fulfilled the requirements of the OT law. He was the true vine.

Furthermore, His hearers (the disciples) - and that includes us, by way of our union with Christ – are considered branches – part of this vine (!) – and as we remain in fellowship with Him, we are fruitful....

We all know that fruit is good for you. And God’s fruit – of love and kindness, is always good. We are bearers of that fruit...



This highlights the importance of staying connected... to Jesus, the true vine; and to each other – as we are the branches. And in staying connected, we bear fruit. We can’t live the Christian life independent from God – of course not - nor each other either. We are connected by fellowship in Him. And so we bear fruit...

In practical terms, and in ‘lock-down’ in particular we need to continue to find ways to stay connected. The following are just some suggestions be way a reminder – I hope it’s useful:

- Read the bible a little each day
- Pray – as you can, not as you can’t
- Think of something practical you can do to help or encourage someone else – maybe pick up the ‘phone...
- Similarly, sometimes there is a season for us to receive help
- Tune in to some of the services available
- Remember God’s love for you is constant and amazing, and doesn’t depend on anything we do!
