Staying connected to God and each other while not meeting as church in the normal way

We continue with Paul's letter to the Romans and some lessons in the outworking of our faith. This week chapter 14.

"So then, we must always aim at those things that bring peace and that help strengthen one another." (Romans 14:19)

Pausing to take stock of things over these past weeks, my reflection is that people have coped with this pandemic and the associated lockdown in various ways. A minority have thrived on it; some have suffered dreadfully; most, I suspect, have found it difficult, one way or another. I count myself in that category. Different responses; different circumstances perhaps. Similarly, there are always different approaches to aspects of Christian living and ways to express our faith. Of course there are; it would be boring if we were all the same, wouldn't it? The interesting thing is that whatever the circumstances we find ourselves in - crisis or otherwise – and however we see things, we can co-exist well and respect our different takes on things, different responses, and grow in love nonetheless. The lesson of Romans 14 is perhaps that attitudes of tolerance and empathy towards others are an important part of gospel living. In all things, in our strengths and our weaknesses, we can point to the God who loves us. God loves all people.... What about us?

In Paul's day, in Romans 14, the issue here was around food laws and religious etiquette. Some Christians' consciences led them to one set of practices; others had a different view. Paul explains that more important than the actual issue is an attitude of love and respect for one another. I am always encouraged when Christians of different persuasions can work and worship together – I think it must bring glory to the God of love

when God's people live together in unity!

² It is like precious oil poured on the head,

even life for evermore.

God of all comfort, bring comfort to those who are sad and grieving; and a special measure of Your consoling love, we pray.

And as the ongoing global crisis continues, help us, Lord, to have big and gracious hearts to those carrying burdens of responsibility on our behalf; and increase our trust in You, we pray.

We pray this week for upholsterers, urologists, used car salesmen and for viral immunologists, veterinary surgeons, video conferencing technicians... bless them with skill, opportunities for service, and peace in times of worry and difficulty.

Thank You Lord, for Your perfect, saving love: expressed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Help us, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to live and work to Your praise and glory. Amen
