“Staying Connected” 21 – Sunday 9th August 2020

Staying connected to God and each other while not meeting as church in the normal way

This week, we come to our last session in Romans: Chapter 16

There seems to be a good, healthy sense of ‘church family’ expressed here in this part of Romans. Paul lists names of people, and there is concern for folk and plenty of personal greetings. Names are important; and calling someone by name shows care and respect, affirms that person and confirms dignity. God is big on human dignity; and isn’t it wonderful – and humbling – that He treats us in such a kind and loving way.

Paul was very much interested in individual people as well as the big theological themes he addresses. We can have that same concern for one another.

There is also some interesting study that can be done on the list of names. Some of the men and women listed were clearly leaders, some had interesting roles in support of the functioning of the church..... **All** of them were valued for who they were.

God’s gift of grace to us is twofold (at least). Firstly, He has made us in His image; and then, secondly, He has called us be a part of his family. None of this because of our own merit; but because He loves us freely. The people Paul lists here were recipients of God’s unmerited favour and love.



I think, in addition to this, Paul was aware of their enormous contribution to the church in different ways. As we know, church is actually the people (not the buildings). And the members of the church are indeed the gifts that God gives for the life and witness of the church fellowship to thrive. Now of course, over a season our different gifts and contributions are expressed in different ways; and we can’t always be as active as we may have been in other seasons, perhaps. It depends on our individual circumstances. But we can all carry that sense of being fellowship together: looking out for each other, praying for one another, and the wider needs around us.

Challenge:

Who might God be prompting you to pray for or help in some way this week? Similarly, who might you ask for prayer or help from, perhaps?

All this is to God's glory. He is surely pleased when his children devote themselves to service in this way.

Paul closes his letter with a note of praise and worship:

²⁵ Now to him who is able to establish you in accordance with my gospel, the message I proclaim about Jesus Christ, in keeping with the revelation of the mystery hidden for long ages past, ²⁶ but now revealed and made known through the prophetic writings by the command of the eternal God, so that all the Gentiles might come to the obedience that comes from faith – ²⁷ to the only wise God be glory for ever through Jesus Christ! Amen. (Romans 16:25-27)

We start our prayers with a great prayer of old:
Create in us, O Lord, a heart forever resigned to your will, a life always mindful of your presence and a devotion eternally dedicated to your glory; through Christ our Lord. Amen.
